Do you have a FAMILY EMERGENCY PLAN?

If you or a family member is detained, it's essential to have a plan to protect your children and ensure they are with trusted family members or friends. Review and complete this information with your family.

Sign (without dating) the legal representation (G-28) and privacy waiver (ICE ERO Form 60-001) forms. Have a folder ready with all the necessary documents and tools to give to the immigration attorney in case of a family emergency.

Reduce your risks!

Know your rights. Everyone has rights, regardless of their immigration status. It's important to know them so you can exercise them in an emergency.

- **DO NOT** open the door unless you see a court order signed by a judge.
- Identify who in your family or friends can safely go shopping, drive, pick up children, etc. Sign forms with the school indicating who can pick up children.
- When immigration enforcement is active, avoid unnecessary outings (ask someone with status to pick up the children or run errands) and avoid areas where ICE targets immigrants (e.g., Home Depot and ethnic shopping areas).
